



2009-2010 Leslie Moore Foundation Scholarship Application for Baltimore County and Howard County Students

The CollegeBound Foundation is a private, nonprofit organization dedicated to encouraging and enabling Baltimore City public school students to go to college. One method by which CollegeBound accomplishes that mission is through the award of scholarships to worthy students. Together with the generosity of the Leslie Moore Foundation, CollegeBound hopes to lighten the burden of financing a college education.

The following scholarship is open to all **high school seniors who attend Baltimore or Howard County Public Schools**. The award recognizes and rewards community service efforts. The Leslie Moore Foundation Scholarship application must be received by **March 1, 2009**. Note all of the required materials to be turned in for the scholarship. If all the required materials are not submitted, you will not be considered for the award.

Leslie Moore Foundation Scholarship

Lenny Moore, former Baltimore Colts halfback, established the Leslie Moore Scholarship Foundation in honor and memory of his son, Leslie Moore. Leslie fought a 9-year battle against scleroderma, a rare autoimmune disease. Leslie inspired many by the courage, strength and character he exhibited. The Leslie Moore Scholarship Foundation was created in memory of Leslie and to offer educational scholarships for local high school seniors who need financial help to attend a post-secondary institution.

Award: One (1) \$2,500 scholarship (renewable) to a senior from a Baltimore County Public High School and one (1) \$2,500 scholarship (renewable) to a senior from a Howard County Public High School.

Criteria: You must: be a 2009 graduate of a Baltimore or Howard County Public High School; have a cumulative high school GPA of at least a **2.0**; **verifiable community service**; submit an **essay** (500-1,000 words) describing the importance of a college education and exceptional community service and extracurricular activities you have been involved in; be accepted and plan to attend a technical school or a 2- or 4-year college or university; finalists must be available for interview with the selection committee; and winners must attend the annual Leslie Moore Scholarship Foundation dinner.

You must include:

- High school transcript (must include first semester of senior year)
- Two (2) letters of recommendation from individuals who can verify your community service experiences
- Copy of acceptance letter(s) to a post-secondary institution(s)
- Resume (must include community service, employment and co-curricular activities {clubs and organizations} for each year of high school as well as any leadership positions held)
- Essay(s), (include your full name on each page; no staples please!)
