The CollegeBound Foundation is a private, nonprofit organization dedicated to encouraging and enabling Baltimore City public school students to go to college. One method by which we accomplish our mission is by awarding scholarships to worthy students. Together with the generosity of the individuals, organizations, foundations and businesses sponsoring these awards, CollegeBound hopes to lighten the burden of financing a college education.

Eligibility

The CollegeBound Foundation seeks to lower the cost of a college education for Baltimore City public school students. Competitive scholarship applicants must excel academically, show exceptional leadership potential and make an impact on their communities through service to others.

To be eligible, applicants must be seniors at a Baltimore City public high school. Applicants must also be U.S. citizens or permanent residents. Current college students are not eligible to apply.

Directions

This application form may be used to apply for as many scholarships as you choose. The requirements for each award differ, so please review them carefully and apply only for the scholarships for which you qualify. Complete and return the application on page 11 and be sure to check off the awards for which you wish to be considered on page 12 (back cover). Make sure to include current contact information. Remove the application page and include all appropriate paperwork with your application.

Checklist

Each application **must** include one copy of each of the following:

- Recent high school transcript (must include the first semester of your senior year)
- Two (2) letters of recommendation
- Resume

Depending on the criteria of the scholarships for which you apply, the following documents **may be** required:

- Essay(s), (must be typed; required essay topics may differ; include your full name and the *name of the scholarship* for which you are applying on the top of each page; **no staples please!**)
- SAT scores (must include copy of official scores or must be on your high school transcript)
- Student Aid Report (SAR), Financial Aid Award Letter (FAAL) or copies of 2008 or 2009 tax forms (only required for scholarships requesting demonstration of financial need)
- Verifiable community service (make sure section I of the resume includes all community service completed during high school)
- Additional letters of recommendation (some scholarships may require letters from specific individuals—teachers, school counselors, community service coordinators, church leaders, coaches, etc.)

All materials must be **received** (postmarks not accepted) on or before **March 1, 2010**.

2010 CollegeBound Foundation Competitive Scholarships

Below and on the following pages are the competitive scholarships for our 2010 scholarship season. Please read carefully and note required materials for every scholarship for which you are applying; each scholarship has different criteria. If all the required materials are not received for a particular scholarship, you will not be considered for that award.

Apply for as many awards as you desire. The awards are organized into six categories to simplify your search: Career and College Major Scholarships, High School Scholarships, Merit Scholarships, Community Service Scholarships, Unique Population Scholarships and University Scholarships.

Career and College Major Scholarships

The Alice G. Pinderhughes Scholarship

One (1) \$500 scholarship (renewable)

This scholarship honors Alice G. Pinderhughes, former Superintendent of Baltimore City Public Schools, who dedicated her career to the education of Baltimore's children.

Criteria: You must: major in the field of education and plan to teach in grades K-12; have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better; demonstrate financial need; and submit a one-page typed essay describing a teacher who has made an impact on you and the reasons why you want to become a teacher.

The Decatur H. Miller Scholarship

One (1) \$1,500 scholarship (renewable)

This scholarship honors Decatur H. Miller, lawyer at DLA Piper law firm and former Chairman of the CollegeBound Foundation Board of Directors. Mr. Miller earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from Yale University and a law degree from Harvard Law School. Throughout his career, he has been and remains a strong professional and community leader.

Criteria: You must: major in the field of political science, history, or pre-law; have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better; an SAT (CR+M) score of at least 1100; and be accepted to and attend Bowie State University, Coppin State University, Frostburg State University, Morgan State University, St. Mary's College of Maryland, Stevenson University, Towson University, University of Maryland College Park, or University of Maryland Eastern Shore. Preference will be given to students who plan to attend law school after graduating from college.

The Dr. Freeman A. Hrabowski, III Scholarship

One (1) \$1,500 scholarship (renewable)

This scholarship honors Dr. Freeman A. Hrabowski, III, President of University of Maryland Baltimore County (UMBC). He has gained national recognition for the development of the Meyerhoff Scholars Program at UMBC.

Criteria: You must: major in the field of mathematics and/or science/technology; have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better; have a competitive SAT (CR+M) score; and be accepted to and attend UMBC.

The George V. McGowan Scholarship

One (1) \$1,500 scholarship (renewable)

This scholarship honors George V. McGowan, former Chairman of the CollegeBound Foundation Board of Directors and Chief Executive Officer of the Baltimore Gas & Electric Company. After completing high school at Baltimore Polytechnic Institute, he earned a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering from the University of Maryland. Mr. McGowan was one of the founders of the CollegeBound Foundation. His commitment to provide the opportunity for higher education is one of the innumerable ways he contributed to Baltimore City.

Criteria: You must: major in the field of engineering; have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better; an SAT (CR+M) score of at least 1000; and be accepted to and attend Bowie State University, Coppin State University, Frostburg State University, Morgan State University, St. Mary's College of Maryland, Stevenson University, Towson University, University of Maryland College Park, or University of Maryland Eastern Shore.

Career and College Major Scholarships

The Janet B. Sondheim Scholarship

One (1) \$500 scholarship (renewable)

This scholarship honors Janet B. Sondheim who was a professional modern dancer, teacher of dance and teacher of emotionally challenged pre-school children.

Criteria: You must: major in: a) fine arts (dance, music, art, drama, photography), or b) any field of study, but you must plan to teach; have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better; and submit a one-page essay describing your accomplishments to date and your personal and professional goals, focusing on why you are interested in a career in the arts or teaching.

Jeanette R. Wolman Scholarship

One (1) \$500 scholarship (renewable)

Jeanette Rosner Wolman earned her law degree in 1924 from the University of Maryland. Although admitted to the Maryland Bar Association, she campaigned for 30 years before she gained membership into the Baltimore City Bar Association which had not previously admitted minorities or women. Mrs. Wolman practiced law for 53 years with her husband in Baltimore.

Criteria: You must: major in the field of pre-law, social work or a field that focuses on child advocacy; and have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better.

Kamal Sanders Scholarship

One (1) \$500 scholarship (non-renewable)

This scholarship was created as a way of giving back to the Baltimore community because of the support Kamal Sanders was provided as a student matriculating through his high school years.

Criteria: You must: major in the field of business; be accepted to and attend a 2- or 4- year institution; have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better; submit an essay (700 words or less) stating why you want to attend college; and submit two (2) letters of recommendation from *current* teachers.

Pathfinders for Autism Scholarship

One (1) \$500 scholarship (renewable)

Pathfinders for Autism is a parent-sponsored, nonprofit organization dedicated to improving the lives of individuals with autism spectrum disorder and their families. In addition to operating an information and referral program, Pathfinders for Autism advocates for general awareness, early detection and intervention, the growth of quality provider services, and for additional lifespan services. Pathfinders for Autism is proud to offer this scholarship to a student who wishes to work toward improving the lives of those with special needs.

Criteria: You must: major in a field that encompasses individuals with special needs (preference is given to those interested in specializing in autism. Examples of such majors are—but are not limited to—psychology, nursing, special education, genetics or pre-med); submit an essay (500 words) describing why you want to work with individuals with special needs; and demonstrate financial need.

The Robert Spar Memorial Scholarship

One (1) \$1,500 scholarship (renewable)

This scholarship honors Robert Spar, Esquire, who worked for Saul Ewing LLP. Mr. Spar earned an undergraduate degree from SUNY-Buffalo and a law degree from Catholic University of America. Throughout his career, he was a strong professional and community leader, serving on the boards of directors for the University of Maryland, Baltimore County Research Park and the Greater Baltimore Technology Council. He also volunteered on the Executive Committee for the CollegeBound Annual Lawyers' Campaign for many years.

Criteria: You must: major in the field of political science, history, or pre-law; have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better; and be accepted to and attend Bowie State University, Coppin State University, Frostburg State University, Morgan State University, St. Mary's College of Maryland, Stevenson University, Towson University, University of Maryland College Park, or University of Maryland Eastern Shore.

The Sheila Z. Kolman Memorial Scholarship

One (1) \$1,000 scholarship (renewable)

This scholarship supports the efforts of Baltimore City Public School students to attend college.

Criteria: You must: major in the field of education or a related field and aspire to become a teacher; have a cumulative 2.5 GPA or better; demonstrate financial need; and submit an essay (500-1,000 words) describing how a teacher affected your life in a positive way.

The Travelers Companies, Inc./CollegeBound Foundation Scholarship

Three (3) to Five (5) scholarships ranging from \$500 to \$3,000 (renewable)

The award amount will be matched by the CollegeBound Foundation. (For example, if a student is awarded \$2,000 from Travelers, CollegeBound will match with \$2,000 for a total scholarship of \$4,000)

The Travelers Companies, Inc. (Travelers) is proud to support the CollegeBound Foundation. Travelers is committed to helping strengthen the pipeline to and through college.

Criteria: You must: major in the field of mathematics, actuarial science, statistics, economics, finance, accounting, marketing, computer information systems, management information systems, computer engineering or business administration; be accepted to and attend Morgan State University; apply for a CollegeBound Foundation Last Dollar Grant at www.collegeboundfoundation.org; demonstrate financial need; submit a one-page essay describing why a college education is important to you; and exhibit a strong desire to achieve.

Please note: Recipients selected may qualify for a \$20,000 scholarship after successfully completing their junior year at Morgan State University. Additionally, all scholars will receive a business mentor.

High School Scholarships

Dunbar Class of 1958 Scholarship

Five (5) \$1,000 scholarships (non-renewable)

The Dunbar Class of 1958 established this scholarship with the intention to give back to the community in which they were raised and went to school. The Class of 1958 views Dunbar as the source of their many successes, and hopes to provide financial assistance so that current graduates have the same opportunities to succeed.

Criteria: You must: be a senior at Paul Laurence Dunbar High School; have a cumulative high school GPA between a 2.0 and a 3.0; and demonstrate financial need.

Georgine Newman Edgerton Scholarship

One (1) \$500 scholarship (non-renewable)

This award has been created by the family of Georgine Newman Edgerton in recognition of her many accomplishments as a community activist, volunteer and advocate for the citizens of Baltimore.

Criteria: You must: be a senior at Frederick Douglass High School, Institute of Business and Entrepreneurship, or Maritime Industries Academy High School; and demonstrate financial need.

Hilton Baltimore Convention Center Hotel Scholarship Fund

Thirteen (13) to fifteen (15) scholarships ranging from \$1,000 to \$3,000 (renewable)

This award has been established in order to increase educational opportunities for the young people of Baltimore City. This fund will award those who are enrolled in hotel, hospitality and/or restaurant management programs.

Criteria: You must: apply for a CollegeBound Foundation Last Dollar Grant at www.collegeboundfoundation.org; demonstrate financial need; major in the field of hotel, hospitality, tourism or restaurant management. Preference is given to seniors from National Academy Foundation.

The KIDS Fund, Inc. Scholarship

Five (5) \$1,000 scholarships (non-renewable)

KIDS Fund, Inc. supports the efforts of Baltimore City public school students to attend college.

Criteria: You must: have a cumulative 2.0 GPA or better; have verifiable community service; and demonstrate need. Preference given to a resident of Govans or a senior at W.E.B. DuBois High School or Reginald F. Lewis High School.

Magaline Thompson Book Scholarship

One (1) \$210 scholarship (non-renewable)

This award was created by Randolph Thompson, a former Assistant Principal at Paul Laurence Dunbar High School, in memory of his mother, Magaline Thompson, in recognition of her sacrifices and dedication as a single mother.

Criteria: You must: be a senior at Paul Laurence Dunbar High School; be a teenage mother; and demonstrate financial need.

Shonda Denise Green Memorial Scholarship

One (1) \$1,000 scholarship (renewable)

Shonda Denise Green was a senior at Western High School (Class of 1998). The Sylvan Learning Foundation has established this scholarship to encourage other Western High School students to strive for a college education and fulfill their dreams.

Criteria: You must: be a senior at Western High School; and have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better.

Merit Scholarships

Aenzi Investments Scholarship

One (1) \$1,000 scholarship (non-renewable)

AENZI INVESTMENTS was created in 2001 to stimulate and educate its members in investments in NYSE and NASDAQ exchanges. Our mission is to be a comprehensive source of investment information and strategies aimed at teaching the principles of collective investment by taking advantage of the global economy and empowering our communities.

Criteria: You must: have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better; demonstrate financial need; and write a one-page, essay that personalizes the following statement: "Obtaining a college degree would be an investment in myself, my community and my country."

Annabelle L. Johnson Scholarship Fund

One (1) \$500 scholarship (non-renewable)

Devoted to a true everyday hero that is gone but certainly not forgotten, the Annabelle L. Johnson Scholarship Fund has been established in memory of the mother of Dominic L. and Adrian S. Johnson. She was a down-to-earth mom who loved her boys unconditionally and who generously gave of herself to her family, friends and her community. She was a lifelong resident of Baltimore City.

Criteria: You must: have a cumulative 2.0 GPA or better; submit an essay (500-1,000 words) describing/honoring a family member who gives of themselves to their family and community; and must be accepted to and attend a 2- or 4- year college or university.

The Baltimore Junior Association of Commerce (BJAC) Scholarship

One (1) \$1,000 scholarship (non-renewable)

Since 1933, the Baltimore Junior Association of Commerce has been helping individuals develop leadership skills through community service by involving young professionals in civic, government and business organizations and working as a team to accomplish common goals.

Criteria: You must: have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better; have at least 200 hours of verifiable community service; and submit a one-page essay describing in detail the community service activities in which you have been involved (specify the amount of time you have committed and describe your involvement—focusing on the importance of these activities to you).

Baltimore Ravens Scholarship Program

Five (5) \$5,000 scholarships (renewable)

At least one scholar will be chosen from the following areas: Baltimore City, Baltimore County, Carroll County.

The Baltimore Ravens established this scholarship program to enable local youth to continue their education on a collegiate level. The team has a long-standing history of service to local communities, and this fund will support those who do the same. In addition, this renewable scholarship will be based on financial need and academic achievement.

Criteria: You must: have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better; demonstrate financial need (include a SAR if available); be accepted to and attend a 4-year college or university; have verifiable community service; submit one (1) reference from an individual who can attest to your commitment to helping others; submit one (1) reference from a teacher, school counselor or administrator; and submit a 2-3 page essay describing the community in which you live and the exceptional community service you have been involved in, and why a college education is important to you and how it will help you achieve your career goals.

Cox Education Fund

Four (4) \$300 scholarships (non-renewable)

This award was created in memory of Thelma Banks Cox. She was an assistant superintendent in the Baltimore City Public School System and the first black president of the Girl Scouts of Central Maryland.

Criteria: You must: be ranked in the top ten of your class when you apply for this award; be Valedictorian in your high school graduating class; and be accepted to and attend a 2- or 4- year college or university.

Green Family Book Award

One (1) \$800 scholarship (non-renewable)

This book scholarship supports the efforts of Baltimore City public school students to attend college.

Criteria: You must: have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better; verifiable community service; demonstrate financial need; and submit an essay (250-500 words) describing a significant experience, achievement or risk that you have taken and its impact on you.

The Jane and Clarence Spilman Scholarship

One (1) \$1,500 scholarship (renewable)

This scholarship honors lifelong city residents Jane and Clarence Spilman, graduates of Forest Park High School and Baltimore City College, respectively.

Criteria: You must: have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better; verifiable community service; an SAT (CR+M) score of at least 1000; and be accepted to and attend Bowie State University, Coppin State University, Frostburg State University, Morgan State University, St. Mary's College of Maryland, Stevenson University, Towson University, University of Maryland College Park, or University of Maryland Eastern Shore.

The Joseph and Rebecca Meyerhoff Scholarship

Three (3) to five (5) scholarships ranging from \$1,000 to \$3,000 (renewable)

This scholarship honors Joseph and Rebecca Meyerhoff and their long-time philanthropic efforts both in Baltimore and around the globe. This scholarship supports the efforts of Baltimore City public high school students to attend college.

Criteria: You must: have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better; an SAT (CR+M) score of at least 1000; demonstrate financial need; and be accepted to and attend Bowie State University, Coppin State University, Frostburg State University, Morgan State University, St. Mary's College of Maryland, Stevenson University, Towson University, University of Maryland College Park, or University of Maryland Eastern Shore.

Merit Scholarships

The Kenneth Hoffman Scholarship

One (1) \$1,500 scholarship (renewable)

Kenneth Hoffman is a partner at the Venable LLP law firm. Among his many civic contributions, Mr. Hoffman is past chair and member of CollegeBound Foundation's Board of Directors. This scholarship honors him and enables Baltimore City public school students to attend college.

Criteria: You must: have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better; verifiable community service; an SAT (CR+M) score of at least 1000; and be accepted to and attend Bowie State University, Coppin State University, Frostburg State University, Morgan State University, St. Mary's College of Maryland, Stevenson University, Towson University, University of Maryland College Park, or University of Maryland Eastern Shore.

Khia "DJ K-Swift" Edgerton Memorial Scholarship

One (1) \$1,000 scholarship (non-renewable)

Khia "DJ K-Swift" Edgerton was a well-known Baltimore DJ, successfully navigating her way into a male-dominated, fast-paced industry. At the age of 18, Khia began interning at 92Q Jams, where she was introduced as DJ K-Swift. Khia worked hard and eventually became a full-time employee, taking on the night show at 92Q. Khia demonstrated the value of hard work and the rewards of passion and commitment to the pursuit of one's dream. In July 2008 Khia met a tragic and untimely end, but her spirit lives on through the people that loved her and her work in the music industry.

Criteria: You must: have a cumulative 2.5 GPA or better; submit SAT (CR+M) scores; demonstrate financial need; and submit an essay (500 words) describing the importance of a college education and why you should receive this award.

Managerial and Professional Society (MAPS) of Baltimore Merit Scholarship

Three (3) \$1,000 scholarships (non-renewable)

The Managerial and Professional Society (MAPS) of Baltimore is pleased to support the CollegeBound Foundation in its efforts to provide students with the opportunity for a college education. MAPS has been in existence since 1973 and is the bargaining unit for managers and professional employees for Baltimore City government.

Criteria: You must: have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better; an SAT (CR+M) score of at least 950; verifiable community service; and submit an essay (500-1,000 words) describing the importance of a college education and community service you have been involved in. Only dues-paying MAPS members and their immediate family members are eligible to apply. Winners must attend a MAPS quarterly meeting held in September.

MECU, Baltimore's Credit Union, Merit Scholarship

Five (5) \$1,000 scholarships (non-renewable)

MECU, Baltimore's Credit Union, is pleased to support the CollegeBound Foundation in its efforts to provide students with the opportunity for a college education.

Criteria: You must: have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better; an SAT (CR+M) score of at least 950; verifiable community service; and submit an essay (500-1,000 words) describing the importance of a college education and community service you have been involved in. Winners must attend a MECU reception and will receive a complimentary credit union membership.

The Richard E. Dunne, III Scholarship

One (1) \$500 scholarship (non-renewable)

Richard E. Dunne, a partner with the law firm of Hogan and Hartson, tragically died in an airplane crash on Thanksgiving Day, 1997. An active supporter and volunteer for the CollegeBound Foundation, learning and doing were key to Rich's approach to life. His good humor and commitment challenged and inspired his family, his friends, and his colleagues alike to make the most of every opportunity. This scholarship honors that commitment by helping to provide students with an opportunity that they might otherwise not have—to attend college.

Criteria: You must: have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better; and have verifiable community service.

The Scarborough-Scheeler Scholarship

One (1) \$1,000 scholarship (renewable)

This scholarship supports the efforts of Baltimore City public school students to attend college.

Criteria: You must: have a cumulative 2.5 GPA or better; demonstrate financial need; submit an essay (500-1,000 words) describing your college expectations; and be accepted to and attend Goucher College, McDaniel College, Towson University, or University of Maryland College Park.

The Travelers Companies, Inc. Merit Scholarship

Two (2) \$5,000 scholarships (renewable)

The Travelers Companies, Inc. (Travelers) is proud to support the CollegeBound Foundation. Travelers is committed to helping strengthen the pipeline to and through college.

Criteria: You must: be accepted to and attend Morgan State University; major in the field of mathematics, actuarial science, statistics, economics, finance, accounting, marketing, computer information systems, management information systems, computer engineering or business administration; demonstrate financial need; submit an essay (500-750 words) describing the benefits you will receive from a mentor relationship and how you plan to reach out and mentor others; and exhibit a strong desire to achieve. Please note: Recipients selected may qualify for a \$20,000 scholarship after successfully completing their junior year at Morgan State University. Additionally, all scholars will receive a business mentor.

The Walter G. Amprey Scholarship

One (1) \$1,000 scholarship (non-renewable)

Walter G. Amprey, former Superintendent of Baltimore City Public Schools, dedicated his career to educating children. This scholarship honors him and supports the efforts of Baltimore City public school students to attend college.

Criteria: You must: have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better; and demonstrate financial need.

Community Service Scholarships

Anna and Eli Berkenfeld Memorial Scholarship

One (1) \$1,000 scholarship (renewable)

This scholarship honors the memory of Anna and Eli Berkenfeld by supporting the efforts of students who have demonstrated financial need to attend college.

Criteria: You must: have verifiable community service; have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better; and demonstrate financial need.

The Baltimore Rotary Service Above Self Award Program

Four (4) \$1,000 to \$1,500 scholarships (non-renewable)

The emphasis of these awards is on good deeds — what the young person does for others without the slightest thought of any kind of reward. Examples of community service include volunteer participation in a neighborhood or school program, service club, or social agency. The student must also display leadership qualities and maintain good grades.

Criteria: You must: have verifiable community service; have a cumulative 2.5 GPA or better; submit a one-page essay describing in detail any volunteer/community activities in which you have been involved, specify the amount of time you have committed, describe your involvement, and explain the importance of this activity to you; and be accepted into an institution of higher learning. Finalists will be asked to participate in an interview. Award recipients must attend an award luncheon.

Elzee Gladden Foundation Scholarship

Five (5) \$1,000 scholarships (non-renewable)

This award was created by Sigma Phi Sigma Fraternity and the Gladden family to honor Dr. Elzee Gladden, a longtime principal at Paul Laurence Dunbar High School.

Criteria: You must: have verifiable community service; be accepted to and attend Morgan State University; have a cumulative 2.8 GPA or better; and demonstrate financial need. Award recipients must attend the annual prayer breakfast held in early November honoring Dr. Gladden.

The Exchange Club of Baltimore Scholarship

Four (4) \$1,000 and one (1) \$2,000 scholarships (both non-renewable)

The Exchange Club of Baltimore is a community service club whose mission focuses on the children of Baltimore City. In 1980, the Exchange Club created the Child Abuse Prevention Center, which has merged with Parents Anonymous to form The Family Tree. The group also supports and contributes to the William S. Baer School to help purchase equipment and teaching materials for severely handicapped children.

Criteria: You must: have verifiable community service; attend a college or university located in Maryland; have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better; an SAT (CR+M) score of at least 1000; demonstrate financial need; and submit a one-page essay describing your personal and professional goals and your expectations for college.

The Joyce A. Kroeller Memorial Scholarship

One (1) \$1,500 scholarship (renewable)

This scholarship honors Joyce Anne Kroeller, the founding Executive Director of the CollegeBound Foundation. During her 10-year tenure, she built CollegeBound into a well-endowed and enormously effective program enabling hundreds of Baltimore City public school students to attend college. She believed passionately in the power of higher education to improve lives. Intensely committed to public service, she worked on behalf of women and children who were abused as well as those who suffered from poverty. She was also an advocate for victims of Alzheimer's disease. Joyce died of melanoma on June 4, 2007 at the age of 57. This scholarship will be awarded to someone who is planning a public service career and thus will emulate her legacy.

Criteria: You must: have verifiable community service; have a cumulative 2.5 GPA or better; demonstrate financial need; submit at least one (1) reference from an individual who can attest to your commitment to helping others; submit an essay (minimum of 500 words) about one of the following topics: 1) describe an individual who has had an impact on you and why or 2) describe the volunteer activities in which you have been involved and how you plan to continue to give back to your community; and be accepted to and attend Bowie State University, Coppin State University, Frostburg State University, Morgan State University, St. Mary's College of Maryland, Stevenson University, Towson University, University of Maryland College Park, or University of Maryland Eastern Shore.

The Leslie Moore Foundation Scholarship

Three (3) \$2,500 scholarships (renewable)

This scholarship honors Leslie Moore and supports the efforts of well-rounded students to attend college.

Criteria: You must: have verifiable community service; have a cumulative 2.0 GPA or better; submit an essay (500-1,000 words) describing the importance of a college education and exceptional community service and extracurricular activities in which you have been involved; be accepted to and attend a 2- or 4-year college or technical school. Finalists must be available to interview with the selection committee. Award recipients must attend the annual Leslie Moore Scholarship Foundation dinner.

Managerial and Professional Society (MAPS) of Baltimore Service Award Scholarship

Two (2) \$1,000 scholarships (non-renewable)

L.J. Smith Charitable Fund Scholarship

Two (2) \$1,500 scholarships (non-renewable)

One female and one male will be awarded.

This scholarship, established by Baltimore Ravens tight end L.J. Smith, supports high school student-athletes in their effort to attend college. Through this grant, Smith will recognize Baltimore City students who not only excel in the classroom, but have enriched their high school experience with sports and extracurricular activities.

Criteria: You must: have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better; be a high school student-athlete (participate in interscholastic sports); and submit one (1) reference from a coach in your respective sport/s.

Preference will be given to those students who are also involved in a leadership capacity in an extracurricular activity.

Reverend Nate Brooks Scholarship

Two (2) \$100 scholarships (non-renewable)
