Last year, Baltimore's CollegeBound Foundation delivered its nationally recognized college access program to thousands of underserved inner city children at 17 Baltimore City public high schools.

921 seniors graduating from one of the 16 high schools served by CollegeBound have been verified as college enrolled this academic school year.

783 or 85% of those same graduating seniors were CollegeBound advised during their high school years.

This spring CollegeBound will make \$350,000 in scholarship grants and over \$700,000 in competitive scholarships available to graduating seniors.
