Greetings from the CollegeBound Team! As the 2022-2023 school year draws to a close, we are grateful to the many people who have supported Baltimore's great students this year. In January, on Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, Baltimore Orioles Chairman and CEO John Angelos announced an extraordinary gift of \$5 million to CollegeBound, the largest gift in CollegeBound's 35-year history! This transformational gift from the Orioles will allow many more Baltimore City Schools' students to achieve their college dreams through Orioles scholarships and internships and advising from CollegeBound. A huge thank you to John Angelos and the Baltimore Orioles from all of us at CollegeBound.

Baltimore's students continue to excel! Our CollegeBound advisors are currently reaching 60% of Baltimore City Schools' seniors and 25% of City Schools' graduates attending 4-year college with the assistance of a Pell grant.

The college students in our College Completion Program — all City Schools' graduates and all Pell grant recipients— continue to graduate from 4-year college at a 75% rate, outpacing their peers across the state.

For the first time in four years, all of our spring and summer signature events are back fully in person: our city-wide Rising Ninth Grade Success Seminar for students and families, hosted by Johns Hopkins University in May; our city-wide Rising Senior Seminar, hosted by the University of Baltimore in June; our College Completion Program celebration of all 326 current scholars in the program at the Under Armour House in June; and our 35th annual Scholars' Luncheon at the Hilton Baltimore on Friday, July 28 at noon. NEW PARTNERSHIPS

CollegeBound has expanded by creating partnerships, beyond our traditional scope, with local Baltimore entities. We now have CAPS (College Access Program Specialists) in 3 Baltimore City middle schools; Cherry Hill Elementary/Middle School, Franklin Square Elementary/Middle School and Lakeland Elementary/Middle School.

In addition, we also have CAPS on-site at 4 community-based organizations (CBOs): the Y of Central Maryland, Harlem Lacrosse, Urban Alliance, and the University of Maryland, Baltimore CURE Scholars Program. Like CollegeBound, these organizations work with talented young people in Baltimore City. They have partnered with us to provide college and career guidance to their participants.









FULL-RIDE COLLEGE ACCEPTANCES


As college acceptances and scholarship offers are awarded, we would like to acknowledge 4 of the many CollegeBound scholars who have been offered full scholarships.

Joy was a member of our Next Generation Scholars cohort which starts with college advising as early as 7th grade. She is also an Urban Alliance intern as well as a MERIT Health scholar through which she gained experience at Johns Hopkins Hospital.
